Additional Dates for AY 2020 New Student Medical Examinations

Student medical examinations, primarily for new international students, will be conducted in November 2020 and January 2021 at the Student Health Care Center as follows. Those who are eligible should make a reservation online. Please wear a mask to the examination. All medical examinations will be conducted by reservation only to avoid crowding. You will NOT be able to fill out your Tohoku University Medical Examination Form (hereafter, "exam form") at the venue. Please fill it out before coming. If Tohoku University's Emergency Action Plan (BCP) level is raised to 3 or higher, the exam will be postponed. It also may be postponed at level 2. Please see the Student Health Care Center website for details. The chest X-ray is mandatory for new students under the School Health and Safety Act.

Dates: November 27 (Fri.) and 30 (Mon.), 2020 & January 7 (Thu.), 2021
To avoid crowding, please come at your appointed time (you can check in 5 minutes early).
Please be punctual.

- 3. Eligibility: New students (undergraduate, graduate) who entered Tohoku University in AY 2020 and have not undergone a medical examination (chest X-ray) this academic year. Includes new non-degree students (research students etc.) entering the university this academic year. Adult students who underwent a medical exam at their workplace or another off-campus facility may submit a copy of their results (must include chest X-ray) to the Student Health Care Center instead of undergoing the university's examination. (However, in this case the center will be unable to issue a Medical Examination Certificate.)
- 4. Making a Reservation (reservations will be accepted from November 17; reservations must be made no later than midnight two days before the desired date)

- 5. Please bring (required):
 - 1 Exam form
 - -Fill out the front and back of the form in pencil as per the provided example (Reference 2), and bring it to the examination.
 - -Please enter your Student ID Number, not your Examination Number, on the form.

- -If you do not have an exam form, please inquire at your graduate school or faculty, or pick one up from the box in front of the Kawauchi Student Health Care Center. (Please note that you will NOT be able to get a form at the Student Health Care Center on the day of the examination.)
- 2 Student ID, or document showing your Student ID Number and name
- 3 A device on which you can display your confirmation email, or a printout of the email
- 4 Black ballpoint pen

6. Type of exam: chest X-ray

Note: Please wear a thin, plain t-shirt for the chest X-ray. (Do not wear clothing/bras/tops with printed patterns, embroidery, metal parts, buttons, etc.) Please do not wear jewelry or accessories (if you have items that you cannot remove for religious reasons, please contact us). If you have long hair, please wear it up so that it doesn't touch your neck or shoulders.

7. Requests:

- -Please wear a mask to the exam.
- -Please comply with government and university instructions (regarding travel from other prefectures etc.), and only undergo the exam if you are eligible.
- -If you feel unwell, or any of the following applies to you, please do NOT undergo the exam.
 - ■You recovered from an illness, or your symptoms subsided, less than 72 hours ago.
 - ■You have been diagnosed with COVID-19 and have not fully recovered.
 - ■You have learned that you were in close contact with somebody who has COVID-19 within the last two weeks.
 - ■You entered Japan less than 2 weeks ago.

8. Issuance of Medical Examination Certificate

-Medical Examination Certificates reflecting the results of this exam will be issued by the Student Health Care Center starting <u>January 6 (Wed.)</u>, 2021 for those who take the exam on November 27 (Fri.) or 30 (Mon.), 2020, and starting <u>February 4 (Wed.)</u>, 2021 for those who take the exam on <u>January 7 (Thu.)</u>, 2021. Medical examination reports can be issued by automatic certificate machines starting on those dates as well.
